The Final Miracle of Jesus in Saint Mark's Gospel.

Today we hear how Jesus gives the blind beggar Bartimaeus back his sight. In the first century most blind people lived as beggars and existed at the lowest levels of society. Very often it is the case that those who acknowledge Jesus as the Messiah come from the insignificant people at the roadside.

When the healing takes place, Jesus is leaving Jericho for Jerusalem where he will die because of the blindness of the Jewish religious leaders, the Scribes and Pharisees who could not see Jesus for who he was. But the blind beggar Bartimaeus could see what others could not see.

Is it possible that I am blind spiritually, emotionally or psychologically? Jesus said to Bartimaeus: 'your faith has saved you'. If we have faith, Jesus can do for us what he did for Bartimaeus.

We may need to ask Jesus to show us where we are blind and give us healing.
